## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2715

1	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS
2	OF HIGHER LEARNING TO DEVELOP A PLAN AND ADMINISTER THE PROCESS OF
3	TRANSFERRING OWNERSHIP AND CONTROL OF THE MISSISSIPPI UNIVERSITY
4	FOR WOMEN TO THE MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY; TO REQUIRE THE
5	RESULTING INSTITUTION TO BE NAMED THE W AT MISSISSIPPI STATE
6	UNIVERSITY; TO SET THE LEGISLATIVE INTENT OF THE ACT; TO REQUIRE
7	THE INSTITUTION TO REMAIN IN COLUMBUS, MISSISSIPPI; TO REQUIRE THE
8	BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO
9	FACILITATE SUCH TRANSFER; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD AND THE
10	DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL TRANSFER THE OPERATION OF THE
11	MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL FOR MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE TO THE W AT
12	MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY; TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-117-1,
13	37-139-3, 37-101-1 AND 25-65-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
14	CONFORM TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT; TO REPEAL SECTIONS 37-117-3,
15	37-117-5, 37-117-7, 37-117-9 AND 37-117-11, WHICH PROVIDE FOR
16	VARIOUS PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE MISSISSIPPI UNIVERSITY FOR
17	WOMEN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
19	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Legislative intent. The Legislature finds that:
20	(a) The Industrial Institute and College was
21	established in Columbus, Mississippi, in 1884, as the first
	obcabilition in columbat, metallitippi, in 1001, as one lilite
22	state-supported college for women in America, later evolving into
23	the "Mississippi University for Women in 1974, and admitting men
24	in 1982;

- 25 (b) The Mississippi University for Women has always
- 26 provided a phenomenal higher education to students with a distinct
- 27 emphasis on professional development and leadership opportunities
- 28 for all, particularly women;
- 29 (c) The Mississippi University for Women is
- 30 consistently ranked as one of the best value schools among
- 31 southern public universities, with low student debt and high
- 32 degree completion rates;
- 33 (d) The Mississippi University for Women remains
- 34 integral to the city of Columbus and continues to receive strong
- 35 support from business, community and governmental leaders in the
- 36 area;
- 37 (e) The modern landscape of higher education is
- 38 continually changing, especially with concerns about enrollment
- 39 nationwide in future years, and the needs, duties and
- 40 responsibilities of institutions of higher learning must adapt to
- 41 this changing landscape;
- 42 (f) Facing declining enrollment and other challenges,
- 43 the Mississippi University for Women, along with its students, the
- 44 state, region and local community, would be better served by close
- 45 collaboration with Mississippi State University, a research
- 46 institution less than 25 miles away from the Mississippi
- 47 University for Women Campus;
- 48 (q) As a regional university connected to Mississippi
- 49 State University, the students of the Mississippi University for

- 50 Women would have access to more undergraduate and graduate degree
- 51 courses and degree paths, student-life options and research
- 52 programs, among other resources and opportunities;
- 53 (h) A collaboration between Mississippi State
- 54 University and the Mississippi University for Women may also
- 55 result in efficiencies and innovations which can help both
- 56 institutions flourish in the future;
- 57 (i) Beginning July 1, 2025, the Mississippi University
- 58 for Women shall transfer all assets and real property, together
- 59 with buildings and other improvements erected thereon, to the
- 60 control and ownership of Mississippi State University;
- 61 (j) The Mississippi University for Women shall
- 62 hereafter be known as "The W at Mississippi State University"; and
- 63 (k) The intent of the transfer provided for in this act
- 64 is to honor the important legacy of the Mississippi University for
- 65 Women and to ensure The W at Mississippi State University shall
- 66 become a successful regional university, remain located in the
- 67 city of Columbus, and that both the campus at Mississippi State
- 68 University in Starkville and The W at Mississippi State University
- 69 in Columbus benefit from their mutual connection.
- 70 **SECTION 2.** (1) Beginning July 1, 2024, the Board of
- 71 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall develop a
- 72 plan to administer the process of transferring ownership and
- 73 control of the Mississippi University for Women to the Mississippi
- 74 State University. The plan provided for in this subsection shall

- 75 also include a plan to ensure the continued success of the
- 76 Mississippi School for Mathematics and Science, currently located
- 77 on the campus of the Mississippi University for Women. The Board
- 78 of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, in concert
- 79 with the Department of Education when applicable for purposes of
- 80 the Mississippi School for Mathematics and Science, shall provide
- 81 all oversight, staffing needs and any other resource to ensure
- 82 such transfer may be completed by July 1, 2025.
- 83 (2) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
- 84 Learning shall ensure that all student records, enrollment
- 85 records, scholarship programs, tuition assessments, endowments and
- 86 other funds are properly transferred from the Mississippi
- 87 University for Women to the Mississippi State University for the
- 88 administration of The W at Mississippi State University.
- 89 (3) Beginning July 1, 2025, The W at Mississippi State
- 90 University shall begin operations with oversight and
- 91 administration provided by the Mississippi State University.
- 92 The W at Mississippi State University shall continue operations in
- 93 Columbus, Mississippi.
- 94 **SECTION 3.** Section 37-117-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 95 amended as follows:
- 96 37-117-1. The institution incorporated by the act of the
- 97 legislature, approved March 12, 1884, and established in pursuance
- 98 thereof, known as the "Mississippi University for Women" shall
- 99 continue to exist as a body politic and corporate by the name of

- 100 the " \* \* \*The W at Mississippi State University" with all its
- 101 property and franchises, rights, powers and privileges conferred
- 102 on it by law, or properly incident to such a body and necessary to
- 103 accomplish the purpose of its creation transferred to the
- 104 Mississippi State University; \* \* \* the Mississippi State
- 105 University may receive and hold all real estate and personal
- 106 property conveyed or given to it for such purposes. \* \* \*
- 107 Whenever the name "Mississippi \* \* \* University for Women" appears
- 108 the same is construed to denote " \* \* \*The W at Mississippi State
- 109 University."
- SECTION 4. Section 37-139-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 111 amended as follows:
- 112 37-139-3. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- 113 School for Mathematics and Science which shall be a residential
- 114 school for eleventh and twelfth grade high school students located
- on the campus of \* \* \* The W at Mississippi State University.
- 116 (2) The school shall be governed by the State Board of
- 117 Education.
- 118 (3) The board shall develop a plan relating to the opening,
- 119 the operation and the funding of the school. Such plan shall be
- 120 presented to the Legislature during the \* \* \* 2025 Regular Session
- 121 and shall include an equitable and reasonable plan for student
- 122 recruitment without regard to race, creed or color.

- 123 (4) The purpose of the school shall be to educate the gifted
- 124 and talented students of the state, and its curriculum and
- 125 admissions policies shall reflect such purpose.
- 126 (5) The board shall prepare the annual budget for the
- 127 school.
- 128 **SECTION 5.** Section 37-101-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 129 amended as follows:
- 130 37-101-1. The following state institutions of higher
- 131 learning shall be under the management and control of a board of
- 132 trustees to be known as the Board of Trustees of State
- 133 Institutions of Higher Learning, namely:
- 134 (a) The University of Mississippi;
- 135 (b) Mississippi State University of Agriculture and
- 136 Applied Science, which shall include The W at Mississippi State
- 137 University;
- 138 (c) \* \* \* The University of Southern Mississippi;
- 139 (\* \* \*d) Delta State University;
- 140 ( \* \* \*e) Alcorn State University;
- 142 ( \* \* \*g) Mississippi Valley State University;
- 143 (\* \* \*h) And any other of like kind which may be
- 144 hereafter established by the state.
- SECTION 6. Section 25-65-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 146 amended as follows:

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          25-65-7. The provisions of this chapter shall only apply (a)
     to the following universities: (i) Alcorn State University, (ii)
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     Delta State University, (iii) Jackson State University, (iv)
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     Mississippi State University, (v) Mississippi State University
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     Agriculture and Forestry Experiment Station, (vi) Mississippi
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     State University Cooperative Extension Service, (vii) Mississippi
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     State University Forest and Wildlife Research Center, (viii)
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     Mississippi State University State Chemical Laboratory, (ix) * * *
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     The W at Mississippi State University, (x) Mississippi Valley
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     State University, (xi) The University of Mississippi, (xii)
     University of Mississippi Medical Center and * * * (xiii) The
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     University of Southern Mississippi; (b) to the following
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     community/junior colleges: (i) Coahoma Community College, (ii)
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     Copiah-Lincoln Community College, (iii) East Central Community
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     College, (iv) East Mississippi Community College, (v) Hinds
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     Community College, (vi) Holmes Community College, (vii) Itawamba
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     Community College, (viii) Jones County Junior College, (ix)
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     Meridian Community College, (x) Mississippi Delta Community
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     College, (xi) Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, (xii)
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     Northeast Mississippi Community College, (xiii) Northwest
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     Mississippi Community College, (xiv) Pearl River Community College
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     and (xv) Southwest Mississippi Community College; and (c) to the
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     following agencies: (i) the Department of Finance and
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     Administration, (ii) the State Tax Commission, (iii) the

- 180 Technology Services, (xvi) the Public Employees Retirement System,
- 181 (xvii) the Mississippi Department of Transportation, (xviii) the
- 182 Mississippi Gaming Commission and (xix) the Mississippi Department
- 183 of Human Services.
- 184 **SECTION 7.** Sections 37-117-3, 37-117-5, 37-117-7, 37-117-9
- 185 and 37-117-11, which provide for various provisions related to the
- 186 Mississippi University for Women, are hereby repealed.
- 187 **SECTION 8.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall take effect
- and be in force from and after July 1, 2024. Sections 3 through 7
- 189 of this act shall take effect and be in force from and after July
- 190 1, 2025.
